- **1. Relationships** building better relationships based on equality and trust with the third sector ensures everyone in our communities has the best opportunities.
- Commissioning make it easier to access longer term funding and to build collaborations that provide high-quality services for communities.
- **3. Empowering –** ensure your focus is on empowering and not controlling communities and allow them to innovate to improve their own environments and achieve sustainability.
- 4. Community health & social care requires investment and valuing of early intervention and prevention which is provided predominately by the third sector. This will relieve pressure on statutory services, building on better integration to improve long term health of communities.
- **5. Added value -** working with the third sector at all levels will bring additional specialised quality skills and funding into an area.
